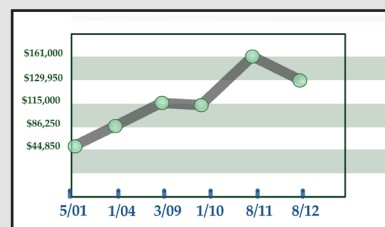

for both rare coin collectors and collectors of significant Americana. This is the first year of the \$10 Gold and of the introduction of gold coins by the U.S. Mint. As the first gold coin issued and the largest denomination, this is the first coin belonging to the single most important series in the history of U.S. currency.

Coinage of the "Eagle" (\$10 Gold) commenced in September of 1795. The accepted mintage is believed to be 5,583 pieces. Five hundred to a thousand are believed to be of the extraordinarily rare 9-leaf variety. The PCGS population shows 17 examples with 16 finer examples. The PCGS Price Guide list the 1795 \$10 Small Eagle with MS62 grade at \$165,000. NGC has only 1 example in this grade with 8 examples of finer quality. It is highly likely that many of these examples graded by both services are duplicates and that there are fewer examples of this quality actually in existence today.

In a PCGS study of auction records from the beginning of certification (1986) to the present, only 7 examples including duplications have sold at auction with the grade of MS62. Only 3 in NCG have appeared at auction.
